

AP Quiz Scoring Guidelines

- AP Quizzes consist of four AP exam-style problems:
3 multiple choice problems and 1 free response problem with multiple parts.
- Some AP Quizzes will require calculators and some will not allow them.
- All AP Quizzes are timed, either 20 or 25 minutes depending on the nature of the problems presented.

Rubric Points, AP Scores, and Quiz Grades

Each AP Quiz is assessed in a manner similar to the AP exam, and a score of 0 through 5 is earned. (Note that it is not possible to earn a score of 0 in the actual AP exam.)

Supporting work is expected for multiple choice problems, and each multiple choice problem will be worth 4 points, 2 points for appropriate work and 2 points for the correct answer.

Free response problems will require detailed work and often written justification. Partial credit may be earned, and each free response problem is weighted equally (12 points) with the three multiple choice problems.
